REQUISITE FOR FILING APPLICATION:

1. Application form is to be filled in by the applicant only and it should be complete. In any case, incomplete or disordered form will not be accepted.
2. The application form must be accompanied with Xerox copies of following certificates.
 - ♣ School Transfer certificate.
 - ♣ SSC/HSC certificate with mark sheet.
 - ♣ HSC/Pre-degree course certificate with mark sheet.
 - ♣ Bonafide and character certificate from the head of institution last attended.
 - ♣ Any other relevant certificate e.g. Vaccination certificate.
 - ♣ Caste certificate, if applicable.
 - ♣ National Domicile certificate.
 - ♣ MNC Diploma and registration certificate.
 - ♣ Year wise MNC General Nursing and midwifery mark sheets.
 - ♣ Course complete certificate.
 - ♣ Experience certificate.
 - ♣ Medical fitness certificate.
 - ♣ Copy of GOVT gazette in case of change in name.
 - ♣ GAP certificate.
 - ♣ Identity proof: Identity card, driving license, pan card.
3. If the space in application form is inadequate, attach additional sheets.
4. Applicant must produce originals of all certificates at the time of interview / admission.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. The degree program will start on the exact date given by MUHS Nashik.
2. You will be responsible to the Principal and the faculty throughout the period of education during the working hours and the warden during non-working hours. When free from assignments, you are not allowed to enter the hospital wards or departments without prior permission of the Principal, teachers or warden.
3. You are not allowed to bring jewellery and mobile while joining this Institution and the Institution will not be held responsible, in any manner whatsoever, for the loss of any valuable object or money.
4. You are requested to observe the time table. The number of working hours per week is 48 which include class room teaching and clinical work. All your assignments whether in the class room or the wards, must be performed as schedule. You are expected to render any help in case of any emergencies in the hospital premises and participate in all the activities of the Institution.
5. As per the policy of the Institution, the pass percentage for all examinations and test is 60%. Unless you obtain the percentage of marks in every subject you will not be eligible to appear for the MUHS Nashik Examination. As part of your training, you will have to work at the Urban and the Rural Community Health Centre; which will be decided by the management of the Institution.
6. During training your conduct is expected to be strictly ethical. You are expected to observe the rules of the Institute of Nursing Sciences, Miraj. You must take healthy interest in your own studies and work and discharge your duties continuously so as to merit a place in the health team of the Hospital and the community.
7. You will not be granted any leave of absence except 30 days of annual leave during every year of the course, which will be decided by the Management. Any other leave of absence must meet the requirements laid down by the MUHS Nashik.
8. In the event of any illness, you are expected to report immediately to the Principal, teacher or warden or if you are on duty in the Hospital ward, you must report to the Head Nurse of the Hospital.
9. You are not allowed to receive rewards or gifts of any kind, at any time, from the patients or patient's relatives.
10. Speaking in any regional language in the Institution, Hostel or Hospitals premises is prohibited. The medium of instruction of the course will be in English.
11. The management may amend above rules and regulation, wherever necessary, and the same shall be binding on the students.
12. During the entire Training Period you will be given boarding and lodging at the rates decided by the management of the Institution. Only vegetarian food will be served in the hostels.
13. Institute of Nursing Science, Miraj is approved by the Maharashtra State Nursing Council, MUHS Nashik, and recognized by the Govt. of Maharashtra. The course is conducted according to the curriculum and syllabus prescribed by the MUHS Nashik. The examination will also be conducted by the MUHS Nashik.
14. All the candidates, seeking admission in this Institution are required to give an undertaking, which should be countersigned by the Parents/Guardian of the respective candidates.

INSTITUTE OF NURSING SCIENCES THE PHILOSOPHY OF THE INSTITUTE

"The most important pathy in Allopathy, Homeopathy & Naturopathy is Sympathy".

Sympathy is the greatest Medicine for all the world's diseases. The sympathetic attitude and compassionate behaviour of nurses goes a long way to ameliorate the pain and suffering of patients and their families who have great expectations from nurses. Nurses have to fulfill the great responsibility that has been entrusted upon them. Along with the spirit of serving, nurses have to keep themselves abreast with new research and technological advances.

Healthcare, infra-structure, organization and training, need transformation for meeting the objective of health for all, as laid down by W.H.O. Disease care is to be replaced by Primary Health Care, which is substantially economical too. A practical example of this change is North Central Bronx Hospital which established a neighborhood Family Care Centre in 1973. The objective was to treat families rather than diseases. For patients suffering from psychological problems the value of family therapy is well accepted.

Late Dr Michel Balient, an internationally renowned psychoanalyst, described the value of doctor's responsibility in his book ***"The Doctor, His Patient and the Illness"*** in the following words. ***'By far the most frequently used medicine in medical practice was the nurse herself. It was not only the medicine but the way the nurses gave them to the patients. In fact the whole atmosphere in which the drug was given and taken.'***

Cure and care of patients have to go hand in hand. Treating the human being rather than just the body is the basis of providing holistic and quality health care. By virtue of its humanistic nature, nursing profession is distinguished by values such as compassion, sympathy, patience, courage and humility. Nurses are pillars of strength, hope and affection for the suffering patients, who turn to them for solace. Up-to-date knowledge and specialized training combined with kindness and empathy are the hallmarks of quality nursing care.

People today are suffering more due to sickness, on the mind hence, the role of nurses is some great importance as they can bring succour to patients with sweet behavior and constant care. This service rendered by nurses is invaluable and unparalleled.

Modern nursing is a dynamic, therapeutic and educative process in meeting the health needs of the individuals, the family and the community. Nursing is one of the health care agencies in assisting families and communities to achieve and maintain desirable standards of health.

The Trust believes in the concepts of health as laid down by the World Health Organization (W.H.O.) i.e.
